Tina van der Wal was a complicated woman. She led a life of secrets and apparent complications.

Her early life seems to have been one with time and money for the better things in life - she was educated and trained in music to a very high degree - even with her secrets she said she was a concert pianist prior to the Depression in Europe - she taught school for some time also. We do not know where she took her university education, but it was probably not in Freisland where she was born.

It is our assumption that she was in the professional class - her father owned an insurance company or very successful agency before the war. She, her sister and brother were raised with every benefit available to them.

She was educated, well read, skilled in music, a competent gardener, a reader. She was opinionated and for the most part, unkind and unforgiving.

An example I love to make is that when I married her son, after knowing her for five years, We went for a dinner at their house and I asked "Now that we are married,

what would you like me to call you?" - her response, after thinking for a few moments, was "Mrs. Feddema". I was not really surprised though because her own sons were not comfortable calling her "Mother" "Mom" or any thing else.... when one of them would call the house, and they wanted to talk to their mother, they would ask the answering person. "Is she there" or "Can I speak to her". After much discussion our children were allowed to call them "Oma and Opa" -- When she wrote to use or signed a card.... she signed "From The Both Of Us". She was the only woman I have ever known that I could say was never not close to her children - she was very controlling, but never close. (Even as very young children she was not ever relaxed or gentle with her children - although she was the parent most present in her children's lives).

The only history we really know anything about is from our experiences and hearsay. She volunteered nothing of her own history.

From morsels of history we have gleaned from papers found, her ex-husband David.

Tina vd Wal was born in Freisland the Netherlands. She lied about her date of birth most of her life it appears. The dates we have on her genealogy come from official NL records though.

She was born before WWI and all of the Europe was affected by this war. May have been married three times total. There is a perfect fit with another marriage in the early 1930's (see Ancestry.com).

She was married at least once before she married Mr. Feddema. This marriage produced my husband, his older brother Ed and two baby sisters that died early on.

She divorced her David Zoetmulder. We have not been able to get the full divorce papers, but she kept the children from seeing their father. Later she moved them to the United States without the father's notification or permission. (This was prior to the International Laws that protect children from this). She continued to receive child support from the father, DF Zoetmulder (deposited to a blind account). She never told the boys about their father, they were allowed to assume that Mr. Feddema, the next husband, was their father - and when they did find out about their father they were either told or were allowed to assume that their father was dead. The children were never told that she received child support for them. The child support was not much by today's standards, but it more than twice exceeded the house payment for the first home they purchased in the United States (Laswell Street). The Zoetmulder boys did not benefit from this support, even though support was still paid until Ron was 21 years of age (and married) and Ed was 25 years old. She allowed the boys bio father to assume the boys were paying for college with the money received after they were 18 years old. She told Ron and Ed that there was not

money for school - anything after high school graduation would have to be paid for by themselves. Ron left home when he was 17 years old - Ed was still at home, although he worked from age 18 on and turned his money over to his mother.

By my experience, (Louise Feddema) she was a nasty woman who cut Ron from her last will without a word explanation. But that was the least of the nasty things she did to her own children.

She really never confronted my husband about meeting with his biological father - except for a few snide remarks - and the one cutting remark "you have met your father and lost your mother". She was a very angry person. Although the meeting occurred in 1981, and she did not die until 2004 - the anger lasted more than 2 decades - and was never spoken about although Ron did occasionally go out of his way to see her, as unwelcome as he was.

She was a cruel and unkind woman, I always tried to find reasons for this. I assumed that World War II scared and changed her. She was so negative and paranoid, I never saw a kind moment or a tender gesture. I did find evidence in the divorce records and early letters (from her to Ron's father) of her manipulation, her self serving words and actions - and then the ultimate "crime"... kidnapping the boys and bringing them to the United States where they were made to live under another name, under a step father that did not like Ron, treated Ron with disrespect and cruelty. She charged Ron for room and board from the age of 15 on. When Ron was a 17 year old, she presented him with weekly bills for laundry, meals, rent, and every little expense that she could add on.

She married Aede Feddema of Freisland after returning to her parent's home after the war. I think the divorce was filed for in Utrecht, this will all be in the 'family file' each person has in the NL. Hopefully some day we will get it.

She worked as an elementary school teacher when Ron was young she was always his teacher until they came to the United States.

The couple Sudmöller-Dickmann had among others 2 sons: Johann Henricus (1733-1798) and Johan David (1743-1808) who established themselves at Schiedam. Before that on 29 January 1770 these were listed Johan Henerick Sudmuller, son of Bals Albert Sudmuller and Catharina Margaretha Diekmans, was baptised 20 October 1738 at Wellingholzhhausen, Roman Catholic Church. The younger son small citizen of Schiedam on May 6th, 1769. Those records show that he was born in Wellingholthausen in Austria. He signed as "Davijd of the Sweets".
